LETTER FROM ... DAUGHTER OF AUBREY RUSSELL

Dear TACAMO family,

I am writing this letter to thank you for the lovely weekend of ceremony and honors dedicated to my lost father at such a memorable time for me and my family. Your generosity, sincerity, and overall healing hospitality brightened my day, and it continues to brighten my home.

For more than 15 years, I had been searching for information about my father, RMC Russell, his time in the Navy and for much of it I searched alone and with no success. However, this all changed a few weeks ago as I somehow became fortunate enough to hear of the reunion and events that were to take place in Oklahoma City. At first, I was hesitant to attempt to attend the event due to my fear of another disappointment. However, that all changed from the moment I began to communicate with all of you there; at first via phone and email, and later personally. From my first

conversations with Shawna, Cheryl, and Rebecca, who opened the doors for my attendance and answered all my questions, throughout my arrival and warm reception at all of the wonderful events, and carrying onward with my memories, I feel as if somehow I have found a piece that was missing from my life.

Words cannot express how touched I was by the memorial of the C-130 aircraft I never knew existed and the respectful and loyal remembrance of those that perished so long ago, and the comforting realization that they had not been forgotten as I had at times feared they had. Perhaps the most heart wrenching displays of my emotional weekend were the Memorial Stairway where memorabilia from Crew 4 was displayed reverently and the heartbreaking sadness of the Missing Man table beautifully



arranged at the banquet, both of which will be a lifelong memory that cannot be forgotten. Most of all, the love and total acceptance by the entire TACAMO family, given to me at such an emotional time, cannot possibly be put into words.

It was so nice to have finally met you all! Your thoughtfulness meant so much to me.
